

Information Released On Ways To Address Body Temperature Changes After Bariatric Surgery

"When you have surgery, any surgery, you have to expect a number of changes to your lifestyle as well as your body while you are healing. These changes can often include various body temperature adjustments as your body heals itself and becomes more accustomed to the changes that you have made," explains Orozco.

Orozco states that bariatric surgery often means a number of changes which include losing weight and experiencing better overall health in general. He says that because of the weight loss due to bariatric surgery, many patients often experience dips or increases in their body temperature.

"Some patients are going to feel as if they are experiencing hot flashes. Others, however, may feel as if they

are literally freezing at all times. This is all perfectly natural and there are a few things that you can do

following your surgery to help maintain your body temperature and to remain more comfortable while you

heal," says Orozco.

The clinic states that bariatric surgery often results in rapid weight loss. In turn, they state that this means the

loss of body fat, which generally helps patients to feel warm. During rapid weight loss, the metabolism also

slows down, which can cause another decrease in body temperature. Orozco recommends keeping a

sweater or jacket handy in cases of cold temperature and being prepared for body temperature changes. He

states that these temperature fluctuations are typically short term. Patient body temperatures typically return

to normal within 18 months or so, after their body weight has stabilized.
