stronger relationships, succeed at school and work, and achieve our work and personal goals. Having the

skills of mindfulness to manage our relationships and develop mature decisions guided by critical thinking

define today's and tomorrow's winners."

During the I Love to Listen Day, Shand-McIntosh will focus on enabling the next generation to truly bloom.

The goal is to develop this lifelong skill in children, equipping them to have healthier social and personal

relationships, and more effective work places.
