This means that holidaymakers will never run out of dining options since all the pubs and bars in the area are only a short distance from one another. Meanwhile, one of the best places to see in Norfolk is The Coal Barn,

which is situated at the water?s edge in Thornham Harbour. It is surrounded by attractive views adjacent to beautiful marshes and creeks. Due to its outstanding, picturesque qualities, it has been the subject of countless paintings over the years and was recently featured on BBC?s Great Expectations.

Meanwhile, Kevin Conroy from Norfolk's Hidden Gems explains that holidaymakers will never run out of things to do in North Norfolk. He says that near Thornham there are beautiful beaches in Holme, Hunstanton and Brancaster, and the area is also known for its walking trails, salt marshes and bird reserves. These areas are concentrated closer to the coast, where most of the best holiday cottages are located and which represents what most people like about staying in Norfolk.

With regard to the best places to stay in Norfolk, the agency recommends three of the newest and top-rated holiday homes in the area.
