While only a handful of locations have been approved, and only evening diggings are allowed, this season is expected to be one of the most fruitful of the past few years.

The pacific razor clam tends to bury itself within a couple of inches of the surface, which practically means that it can be easily dug up with a clam shovel without any trouble. This does not mean, however, that specialized gear cannot facilitate the process. The store states that certain equipment, such as a clam gun, can ease the

process and narrow the time down to a few minutes per dig.

The store recommends the Danielson clam gun, as this is a piece of equipment that has been battle-tested

and deemed one of the best for the task. This clam gun has been engineered specifically for removing razor

clams from sandy ocean beaches. It features solid all-steel construction that makes it strong enough to

burrow into any shore in pursuit of shellfish, easily digging them up for recollection. Using the Danielson clam

gun should be easy enough even for beginners, with the most difficult part of the process being actually

spotting the potential spots to dig.

The company says, "You should be able to catch a substantial number of clams with this gun, even if you've
