The Recovery Program offers a judgment-free zone for men to come together and help each other through their problems with substance abuse. Substance abuse challenges are best addressed with unique solutions. NSR of Asheville states that through its program they help men reclaim lives of meaning, value, and responsibility. Their addiction treatment programs for men facilitate the transition from detox or inpatient rehab to lifelong self-sufficiency. They use a combination of clinical therapy, structure, and community to establish order amidst the mental chaos of addiction recovery.

Their addiction treatment program equips men with interpersonal skills that can help to repair relationships. According to the program's observations, in a family unit, the one who is addicted is not the only one that needs healing. Addiction takes a tremendous toll on families who often struggle for years with the emotional, financial, and physical consequences of untreated addiction. Recovery often includes a relapse, job loss, and tumultuous relationships. These patterns can rapidly snowball particularly when families don't get support for their own recovery process. Admission to the program is voluntary and at the discretion of the NSR of Asheville. The program requires residents to commit to a minimum of 90 days; however, the average length of stay is 6-9 months. At 12 months, the length of stay will be re-evaluated by the Executive Director. All new applicants must submit and pass a background check application. The documents needed are a house contract and a release of information form, both of which are available for download. There is an admission application that can be submitted at an application portal.
