She disagrees with this plan as it has many pitfalls, one of which is that the child may have to pay more in capital gains tax. In Phoenix, there has been substantial increases in real property values, which means potential gains are significant. Putting the child as a co-owner will cause them to pay a large amount in capital gains tax when they sell the property after the owner's death.

Libby Banks says, "Saving your children from taxes is one very good reason not to put them on title during your lifetime. Instead, think about creating an estate plan with a revocable living trust to allow your child to easily inherit the property on your passing with no probate court proceeding. They save taxes, time, and money on wrapping up your estate."

According to Libby Banks, another reason to avoid putting the name of the child on the home title is to ensure that one has full control over one's home. With someone else on the title, the owner loses full control of the

property. For instance, selling the property would need the child's signature and the problem occurs when the child doesn't want to sell it. Without the child's consent, the owner is unable to proceed with what they want to do with the property.
