Gum massagers are a useful option for back teeth that can be almost impossible for teethers to reach. A gummy teething stick, the massager has an anti-choking shield. Another option is to use the parent's clean finger or knuckle to massage the gums.

Frozen washcloths may also provide much needed pain relief and are easy for babies to hold on their own as they bite and suck on them. A wet, clean washcloth that spends 30 minutes in the refrigerator or freezer often does the trick.

For babies who are eating, mesh teethingers with frozen fruit may be a helpful solution. If a mesh teether is not available, wrapping a piece of frozen fruit in a handkerchief or washcloth will allow baby to get the benefit of pain relief, while enjoying the sweet taste of fruit.

For babies eating solids, gnawing on a crunchy cold food, such as a carrot or celery, can be perfect for putting pain relieving pressure on swollen gums. If a baby is not eating solids, applesauce or yogurt is often a good option.

Camilla, whose active ingredient is a diluted form of the Chamomile plant, is available in single-use drops. Due to its anti-inflammatory properties, it relieves pain and swelling. The company says it is a great option at night when a baby's sleep is being disrupted.

Hyland's teething tablets have been used for generations to soothe pain and ease irritability. These small tablets quickly dissolve and are particularly effective when followed up with a teething toy. A pediatrician should be consulted prior to giving a baby any ingestible pain relief option.
