Many learn of easements only when selling, refinancing, or building, prompting questions about land use limits and steps that may help reduce future disputes.

The firm identifies several common ways easement rights may arise or be claimed, including a written grant, a recorded plat, implication, necessity, or long-term use that may support a prescriptive easement claim, depending on the facts and applicable South Carolina law. Each type may have different consequences for current and future owners.

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Questions about beach paths, shared access, and driveways serving multiple homes are common in resort and coastal communities, where several parties may rely on the same land. When an easement covers multiple lots or connects to a private road maintained by a property owners' association, interpreting documents, covenants, and maintenance obligations can cause disputes if not addressed before closing.

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Easement issues often arise during due diligence, when surveys or title searches reveal encumbrances, during construction near boundaries or utility lines, and in neighbor disputes over parking, landscaping, fencing, or encroachments. Careful legal analysis can help clarify permitted uses, possible limitations, and potential remedies if the scope of an easement is disputed or exceeded.

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In addition to real estate closings and contract drafting, The Fraser Law Firm, LLC reviews deeds, plats, and title commitments to identify easements and explain their impact on property value, development options, and long-term plans. Many buyers focus on price and inspections but may overlook how even a single easement, such as a drainage or utility easement, can restrict future improvements like pools or additions.
