Proper collision repair restores alignment while helping ensure repaired components fit and function as intended.

Modern vehicles also include advanced driver-assistance technologies that deserve careful attention following an accident. Cameras, radar sensors, parking sensors, blind spot monitoring systems, and other electronic safety features are commonly mounted behind bumpers, mirrors, windshields, and body panels. According to Bale Collision Center, even minor impacts can influence the positioning of these components, making a comprehensive inspection an important part of the repair process.

The company notes that hidden damage is frequently discovered beneath exterior panels.
