For darker or more dramatic contrast, Wenge provides rich chocolate tones with a straight grain pattern that creates a bold focal point in custom installations.

Applying appropriate protective finishes, such as mineral oils or protective sealants, helps shield wood fibers from moisture exposure around sinks and food preparation areas.
