



Inland Power Wash Details Surface Assessment Approach to Graffiti & Paint Removal

Inland Power Wash, a family-owned exterior cleaning company based in Southern California, has outlined its surface-assessment methodology for graffiti and paint removal, emphasizing that matching treatment to each surface protects the underlying material while restoring appearance.

The company noted that effective removal depends far more on proper treatment selection than on applying maximum pressure. Excessive pressure can etch concrete, erode mortar joints, and mar masonry, leaving lasting damage even after unwanted paint is gone. To avoid this, technicians evaluate each surface before beginning work, then choose surface-appropriate cleaners, controlled pressure levels, and hot water where suitable.

According to the company, the process typically begins by identifying the surface type, whether concrete, brick, block walls, masonry, or sidewalks, along with the nature of the paint involved. Professional graffiti-removal products are then applied to soften and break down the paint before the area is carefully rinsed. The same measured approach applies to paint spills and drips, construction overspray, utility marking paint, and residue left behind by previous painting projects.

The company also addressed why prompt attention matters. Fresh markings and spills are generally easier to lift before they cure fully or weather into the surface, and rapid removal on commercial properties can limit repeat vandalism, which studies in property management have long associated with visible, unaddressed graffiti.

"Surface assessment is the step that separates a clean result from a damaged wall," said Dennis Vong of Inland Power Wash. "Two brick walls can react very differently to the same product, so the treatment has to be selected for the material in front of us, not applied by habit. That careful reading of the surface is what allows the paint to release without harming the substrate underneath."

Vong added that timing plays a meaningful role in outcomes. "Fast removal makes the work easier and the results better," he said. "When graffiti is addressed quickly, the paint has had less time to bond, and property owners see fewer repeat incidents. That is why responsiveness is treated as part of the service rather than an afterthought."

Inland Power Wash provides both residential and commercial graffiti removal, serving retail centers, apartment communities, office buildings, schools, restaurants, warehouses, industrial properties, parking structures, construction sites, sidewalks, and shared common areas. The company noted that certain projects fall outside its scope, including whole-house paint stripping, lead-paint abatement, and large-scale industrial coating removal.
