

Environmental Firm Revises Indoor Air Quality and Testing Protocols

The firm stated that it now utilizes thermal imaging technology combined with standard scientific methodologies to identify areas of suspected fungal growth. The revised service protocol incorporates a systematic approach that includes non-invasive visual assessments, digital moisture mapping using infrared cameras, and quantitative air quality tests using calibrated bioaerosol sampling pumps. This specific methodology is designed to assist technicians in the identification of various mold species and to measure the approximate extent of indoor contamination.

Dr. Michael Thompson, an environmental consultant at the firm, directed this recent procedural update. Dr. Thompson noted that timely environmental evaluations can sometimes identify persistent moisture issues before they lead to severe structural damage or create environments conducive to rapid spore growth. He stated that the company's updated practices were developed to align with current Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) guidelines regarding indoor air quality. According to Dr. Thompson, these revised protocols dictate that standardized environmental data is collected during every mold inspection in Tenaflly, NJ, with the primary goal of objectively identifying common indoor hazards.

In addition to modifying its service delivery protocols, Environmental Assessments & Solutions, Inc. has published informational materials concerning indoor airborne particulates and building moisture control.
