

Rancho Solano Preparatory School Expands Academic and Extracurricular Programs

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Rancho Solano Preparatory School has expanded its academic offerings with additions in classroom technology, social and emotional learning, and extracurricular programming across its grade levels.

The school said the additions were developed together rather than introduced as separate efforts, and that scheduling was adjusted to accommodate the new programming without extending the school day. Administrators said planning took place over the previous academic year with input from teaching staff and department leads.

The technology component gives students expanded access to digital tools and instructional resources in the classroom. School officials said the focus is on digital literacy and analytical skills rather than on the tools themselves, and that instructors determine how the resources are used within individual courses. Officials said teacher preparation for the technology component was completed before the programming began.

The social and emotional learning component addresses communication, collaboration, and how students manage setbacks. Administrators said the material is delivered within existing coursework rather than as a separate class, and that instructors received preparation on how to incorporate it into subject-area instruction. Officials said the school will review how the approach is working before deciding whether to expand it.

Extracurricular offerings have also been broadened, with additions across clubs, athletics and arts programming. School officials said the expansion was based on student interest surveys conducted during the previous year, and that several additions came directly from student requests. Administrators said scheduling was arranged so that students participating in athletics are not excluded from arts activities.

The expansion comes as families evaluating private schools in Scottsdale, AZ consider factors including academic programming, technology access and activities available outside the classroom. School officials said questions from prospective families about technology use and student support have become more frequent during recent admissions cycles.

Administrators said staffing was a consideration throughout the planning process. Officials said the school reviewed which existing courses would be affected by the new programming and how instructional time would be distributed before the additions were finalized. The school said some course sequences were adjusted as a result.

School officials said they plan to gather feedback from students, families and faculty as the programming continues through the academic year. Administrators said adjustments will be made based on that feedback rather than on a fixed review schedule, and that individual components may be expanded or scaled back depending on how they are received.

The school said it also intends to assess how the additions affect existing academic outcomes before committing to further expansion. Officials said no timeline has been set for that assessment, and that results from the first full year of programming will inform what comes next.

Officials said the extracurricular additions required coordination with facilities scheduling, since several new activities compete for the same spaces used by existing programs. Administrators said meeting times were staggered across the week to avoid conflicts, and that some activities were placed before the school day rather than after it.

The school said it also reviewed how the additions would affect students already carrying heavier course loads. Officials said advisers were asked to discuss commitments with students individually during scheduling rather than applying a limit on participation across the board.

Administrators said communication with families has been adjusted alongside the programming changes. Officials said parents receive updates covering how the new components are being delivered in the classroom, in part because the social and emotional learning material is integrated into subject-area coursework rather than appearing separately on a schedule.
