



Survivors of Abuse NY Updates Doctor Sexual Abuse Resources

NEW YORK, NY - August 21, 2026 -

Survivors of Abuse NY has updated its informational resources concerning doctor sexual abuse and related civil claims, with the materials addressing legal issues that can arise when alleged misconduct occurs in medical settings. The New York City-based resource, created by attorney Thomas Giuffra, Esq., is intended to provide information about civil procedures, professional oversight, and factors that may affect claims involving physicians and medical institutions.

The update focuses on circumstances in which alleged sexual misconduct occurs during medical examinations, treatment, or other interactions between physicians and patients. It also explains that allegations involving medical professionals can raise separate questions involving professional conduct, institutional supervision, patient records, and civil liability.

"Medical abuse matters can involve both individual conduct and questions about the responsibilities of institutions that employ or supervise medical professionals," said Thomas Giuffra, Esq., attorney and creator

of Survivors of Abuse NY. The updated materials are intended to explain the legal framework surrounding these cases and the types of records and procedures that may become relevant during a civil claim.

Doctor sexual abuse allegations can involve conduct that a patient contends occurred outside the legitimate scope of an examination or treatment. Civil cases may require review of medical records, appointment histories, communications, institutional policies, and other documentation that provides context concerning the physician-patient interaction.

Medical institutions maintain policies governing professional conduct, reporting procedures, supervision, and patient care. When a civil claim involves both a physician and an institution, the legal analysis can include questions about what the institution knew, what information was available to responsible personnel, and what actions were taken before or after an allegation was reported.

Professional disciplinary proceedings and civil lawsuits are separate processes. A complaint involving a licensed physician may result in review by a professional licensing or regulatory authority, while a civil lawsuit addresses legal claims and remedies available through the court system.

The updated doctor abuse information also discusses evidence that may be examined when evaluating an allegation. Relevant material can vary by case and may include medical documentation, scheduling records, correspondence, internal complaints, witness information, and policies that were in effect when the alleged conduct occurred.

New York civil claims are also governed by filing deadlines that depend on the circumstances of the case. The applicable period can be affected by factors including the date of the alleged conduct, the age of the person at the time, the identity of potential defendants, and legislation governing claims arising from sexual abuse.

Determining whether a claim remains eligible for filing therefore requires examination of the facts and the law applicable to the particular circumstances. General information about filing deadlines does not establish whether an individual matter can proceed, because different legal provisions may apply to different defendants and factual situations.

Civil litigation involving alleged doctor sexual abuse can include claims against an individual practitioner and, in some circumstances, claims involving a hospital, medical practice, clinic, or other organization. The legal basis for an institutional claim depends on the relationship between the parties, the alleged conduct, available evidence, and the duties established under applicable law.

The litigation process can involve document collection, pleadings, discovery, witness testimony, expert

analysis, motions, settlement discussions, and trial proceedings. Not every matter follows the same sequence, and the procedural history of a case can depend on the defendants, available records, disputed facts, and rulings made by the court.
