Personal injury litigation generally concerns allegations that an individual, business, property owner, health care provider, or other party failed to meet a legally applicable standard of care. A claim may require examination of how an incident occurred, whether a duty existed, whether an alleged breach contributed to an injury, and what losses can be documented through records or other evidence.

Motor vehicle matters can involve passenger vehicles, commercial vehicles, motorcycles, pedestrians, or other roadway users. Case evaluation may include police reports, photographs, medical records, witness information, insurance documents, vehicle records, and other materials related to the circumstances of a collision.

Premises-related claims may require a different factual review. Attorneys may examine property conditions, maintenance records, incident reports, photographs, notice of an alleged hazard, and information concerning responsibility for the location where an injury occurred.

Product-related and medical matters can involve additional documentation and technical issues. Product cases may concern the design, manufacture, warnings, or use of an item, while medical malpractice matters can require review of treatment records and the professional standards applicable to the care at issue.

The firm also handles workplace-related injury matters, which can involve different legal procedures depending on the circumstances of an incident and the parties involved. Civil claims and workers' compensation matters can operate under separate legal frameworks, making the classification of a claim an important part of the initial review.

Case-specific determinations require examination of the facts and the law applicable to the particular matter.
