



Disaster Plus Raises Awareness of Timely Mold Remediation for Healthier Indoor Environments

"Mold is often a symptom of a larger moisture problem, and acting quickly makes a meaningful difference in the outcome," said Keating Norris, spokesperson for Disaster Plus. "Property owners are paying closer attention to the air inside their homes and workplaces, and that has changed how they respond when they notice signs of mold."

The company notes that the awareness effort reflects a broader shift in how property owners view indoor conditions. Rather than treating visible mold as a cosmetic issue, many now recognize that unaddressed growth can affect building materials and the comfort of occupants over time. Disaster Plus emphasizes that thorough documentation during the remediation process also assists property owners who file insurance claims, as the company records the extent of the damage and provides supporting information.

"The goal is to restore a property to its original condition while resolving the conditions that created the problem in the first place," Norris said. "When residents understand how mold develops, they are better prepared to seek help before the situation grows."

For commercial clients, the company works to minimize downtime so businesses can resume operations. For residential clients, the focus includes addressing leaks, floods, and moisture buildup while advising on strategies that reduce the likelihood of recurrence. Disaster Plus operates around the clock and works with insurance providers throughout the restoration process.
