

Arid Valley Plumbing Expands Capacity and Adds Diagnostic Equipment

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Arid Valley Plumbing has expanded its operations as a plumber in Phoenix, AZ, adding diagnostic equipment, hiring technicians, and introducing water conservation services for residential and commercial customers.

The expansion includes leak detection equipment and pipe inspection cameras, according to the company. Representatives said these allow technicians to locate problems inside walls and underground without opening surfaces first, which reduces the amount of exploratory work required before a repair begins.

Leak detection is a particular focus given local conditions, according to the company. Representatives said slab leaks are common in the area because of construction methods and soil conditions, and that locating them precisely determines whether a repair requires opening a small section of flooring or a much larger area.

Camera inspection is used for drain and sewer lines, according to representatives. They said the equipment shows the condition of a line rather than only whether it is blocked, which they said matters when deciding between clearing a line and replacing a section that is failing.

Hiring is part of the expansion, according to the company. Representatives said licensed plumbers are being added to handle the increased call volume, and that new technicians complete training on the diagnostic equipment before working independently.

Water conservation services were added in response to customer interest, according to the company. Representatives said these include installation of water-saving fixtures and assessment of where household water use concentrates, and that outdoor irrigation typically accounts for more consumption than customers expect.

Homeowners looking for a plumber in Phoenix, AZ often call about water pressure, drain problems or unexplained increases in a water bill, according to representatives. They said an unexplained bill increase

frequently indicates a leak that has not surfaced visibly, which is where detection equipment is most useful.

Water quality work is also part of the expanded offering, according to the company. Representatives said filtration system inquiries have increased, and that system selection depends on what a customer is trying to address, since different systems handle different water characteristics.

Commercial work accounts for a portion of the added capacity, according to the company. Representatives said commercial plumbing often requires scheduling around business hours and coordination with other trades during construction, and that the added staffing makes those schedules easier to accommodate.

The company has also launched a blog covering plumbing maintenance. Representatives said topics include seasonal maintenance and fixture selection, and that the material describes conditions warranting a call to a licensed plumber rather than instructing readers to attempt repairs themselves.

Summer conditions affect the work locally, according to the company. Representatives said heat affects both scheduling for outdoor work and the condition of exposed piping and fixtures, and that certain problems appear more frequently during the hottest months.

Water hardness is a recurring subject in local service calls, according to representatives. They said mineral content in area water affects fixtures, water heaters and appliances over time, and that customers often call about a specific failure without connecting it to a broader condition affecting the system.

Water heater work accounts for a steady portion of calls as well, according to the company. Representatives said units in the area sometimes reach the end of their service life earlier than expected, and that assessment covers whether a unit warrants repair or replacement rather than defaulting to one or the other.

Emergency calls are handled alongside scheduled work, according to representatives. They said situations involving active leaks or a loss of water service are prioritized over routine appointments, and that the added staffing was intended partly to keep those interruptions from displacing scheduled jobs.

The company said it plans to review capacity as the new technicians are integrated. Representatives said decisions about further hiring will depend on call volume over the coming months, and that no timeline has been set.
