

Advanced Veneers and Implants Adds All-on-X Implants in Charlotte

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Advanced Veneers and Implants has announced the introduction of All-on-X implant treatment at its Charlotte, North Carolina, practice. The addition expands the practice's restorative options for patients experiencing significant tooth loss and reflects broader developments in implant-supported dental rehabilitation.

The treatment known as all-on-x dental implants in Charlotte, NC, uses a small number of strategically positioned dental implants to support a full arch of replacement teeth. Depending on a patient's oral health, bone structure, and treatment plan, the approach may use four to six implants to support the prosthetic arch.

All-on-X treatment has become part of a broader shift in implant dentistry toward treatment plans designed to reduce the number of implants required for full-arch restoration. In some cases, strategic implant placement may also reduce the need for additional procedures such as bone grafting, although treatment requirements vary by patient.

"Our goal is to make sure patients understand the options available to them when they are dealing with extensive tooth loss," a spokesperson for Advanced Veneers and Implants said. "All-on-X treatment gives us another approach to consider when developing an individualized restorative plan based on a patient's oral health, functional needs, and long-term goals."

The practice said the introduction of the treatment comes as dental professionals continue to evaluate techniques that can improve treatment efficiency while restoring chewing function and supporting long-term oral health. Digital imaging, implant planning technology, and advances in restorative materials have contributed to changes in how full-arch implant cases are assessed and completed.

Advanced Veneers and Implants has also published educational information addressing how All-on-X treatment differs from more traditional implant approaches. The resource covers treatment considerations, procedural requirements, recovery, maintenance, and factors patients may want to discuss with their dental

provider before deciding whether implant-supported restoration is appropriate.

The availability of all-on-x dental implants in Charlotte, NC, also reflects continued interest in treatment plans tailored to patients with multiple missing or failing teeth. Rather than replacing each missing tooth with an individual implant, full-arch techniques can use several implants as the foundation for a fixed prosthetic restoration.

Patient evaluation remains an important part of the process. Factors such as bone density, gum health, existing medical conditions, oral hygiene, and the location of remaining teeth can affect whether a patient is a candidate for treatment. Diagnostic imaging and clinical examinations are generally used to determine implant placement and develop an appropriate treatment plan.

The announcement comes amid continued developments in restorative and implant dentistry, including greater use of digital treatment planning and technologies designed to improve precision during implant placement. These tools can help dental teams evaluate anatomical structures, plan implant positions, and coordinate the restorative phase of care.

Long-term maintenance is another consideration for patients receiving implant-supported restorations. Routine dental visits, appropriate home care, and monitoring of the implants and surrounding tissues remain important after treatment. Patients are typically given individualized guidance based on the design of their restoration and their overall oral health.
