Regular brushing and flossing remain important, as do routine dental examinations. Patients should also avoid using their teeth to bite hard objects or open packages, since excessive force can damage natural teeth and dental restorations.

The expected lifespan of veneers varies. Factors such as the material, oral hygiene, bite forces, dietary habits, and general dental health can affect how long a restoration remains functional and aesthetically acceptable. Veneers may eventually require repair or replacement, and patients should discuss long-term maintenance with their dental provider.

Lifestyle habits can also be relevant. Patients who grind or clench their teeth may have an increased risk of damaging dental restorations. A dentist may recommend an appropriate protective appliance in certain circumstances. Similarly, patients who participate in activities that carry a risk of dental injury may benefit from discussing protective measures.
