



More Congleton All-on-4 Dental Implants Full-Arch Teeth Replacement Consultations Made Available at Crown Bank Dental

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Crown Bank Dental Congleton has added more appointment slots to the implant practice diary from September 2026. The expanded availability means an increased number of patients across Cheshire can now access consultations for All-on-4 dental implants and full-arch teeth replacement. The move is aimed at helping those who are suffering from poor quality of life due to missing teeth. For such patients, access to specialist implant consultations has been more limited until now.

All-on-4 refers to a treatment concept in which four titanium posts are placed into the jawbone to support a full arch of replacement teeth, and has become a widely recognised term within implant dentistry for full-arch restoration. Where treatment is clinically successful and osseointegration ? the process by which the implant fuses with the surrounding bone ? is achieved, the implants anchor directly into the jaw. In such cases, and subject to ongoing maintenance and clinical review, the resulting restoration is generally intended to remain stable during eating, speaking, and other daily activities, though individual outcomes vary depending on patient-specific factors and adherence to post-treatment care. The four-implant approach is designed to maximise the use of available bone, though anatomical suitability varies between patients and can only be

determined through individual clinical assessment. In some cases, adjunctive procedures may be required before implant placement can proceed, and the treating clinician will outline any such requirements during the consultation.

The consultation process begins with the dental team assessing jawbone density, gum health, and overall suitability for treatment. Scans and imaging form part of this assessment, giving the dentist a detailed view of the bone structure before treatment planning begins. The implant dentist will discuss any clinical considerations relevant to the patient's situation during this appointment, ensuring each patient has the information needed to make an informed decision before proceeding.

A longitudinal study by Malo P, de Araújo Nobre M, Lopes A, Moss SM, and Molina GJ, published in the Journal of the American Dental Association in March 2011, volume 142, issue 3, pages 310 to 320 (DOI: 10.14219/jada.archive.2011.0170), examined outcomes across 245 patients treated with 980 immediate-function implants in fully edentulous mandibles. The study found cumulative implant-related success rates of 98.1% at five years and 94.8% at up to 10 years, with an overall prosthesis survival rate of 99.2% over the same follow-up period. The researchers concluded that the All-on-4 immediate-function concept is viable in the long term, supporting its use as a reliable protocol for full-arch fixed restoration in completely edentulous mandibles. These findings are specific to the mandible and to the patient population studied, and should not be generalised as expected outcomes for all patients. They do, however, provide relevant published context for the role that structured treatment planning and long-term follow-up play in full-arch implant outcomes.

In certain cases where clinical assessment confirms suitability and bone condition specifically supports immediate loading, temporary teeth may be fitted on the same day as implant placement. This is not a routine outcome and depends entirely on individual clinical circumstances determined at assessment. Where same-day loading is not indicated, patients follow a staged treatment timeline, with permanent teeth fitted once the implants have fully integrated with the surrounding bone.

Not every patient presenting with tooth loss requires a full-arch solution. Consultations for single dental implant placements are also available, addressing situations where one tooth is missing rather than a complete arch. A single implant involves placing one titanium post into the jawbone, supporting a crown matched to the surrounding natural teeth in appearance and function. Where treatment is successful and clinical circumstances are favourable, single implants can function in a manner broadly comparable to a

natural tooth during biting and chewing.
