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Cardinal Family Dentistry, led by Dr. Emily Green, has expanded its endodontic care offerings to provide comprehensive evaluation and treatment for compromised teeth in Apex, North Carolina. The practice's updated service focus aims to address severe dental pain, treat internal tooth infections, and perform root canals in Apex, NC using modern endodontic techniques designed to preserve natural tooth structure.

Root canal therapy, clinically known as endodontic treatment, is a routine procedure required when the pulp tissue inside a tooth becomes inflamed or infected. Internal infection typically stems from deep tooth decay, repeated dental procedures on a single tooth, cracked enamel, or traumatic injury. Leaving an infected root canal untreated can lead to persistent pain, abscess formation, surrounding bone loss, and the ultimate loss of the affected tooth.

Endodontic therapy focuses on removing infected vascular and neural tissue from within the tooth's interior canal system, restoring structural integrity, and sealing the space to prevent future bacterial contamination. Advances in modern local anesthesia, digital diagnostic imaging, and rotary endodontic instruments have streamlined the process, making it comparable to receiving a routine filling in terms of comfort and efficiency.

The standard endodontic procedure involves several key clinical steps:

Diagnostic Imaging and Anesthesia: Digital X-rays are utilized to evaluate the specific anatomy of the root canals and assess the extent of surrounding bone involvement. Local anesthesia is administered to ensure complete numbness throughout the site. **Access and Cleaning:** A small opening is created in the crown of the tooth to access the pulp chamber. Specialized rotary instruments are used to carefully clean, shape, and disinfect the internal root canals. **Obturation and Sealing:** Once the canals are thoroughly disinfected and dried, they are filled with a biocompatible, rubber-like material called gutta-percha. The material is sealed with adhesive cement to isolate the root system from bacteria. **Restoration:** After the root canal is sealed, a temporary or permanent filling is placed. In most cases, particularly for molars and premolars that endure heavy chewing forces, a full-coverage crown is recommended to restore structural strength and protect the tooth from fracture. Following an endodontic procedure, mild sensitivity or tenderness in the surrounding gum

tissue is normal for a few days, particularly when chewing. This temporary discomfort is typically managed with over-the-counter pain relievers or prescribed post-care protocols.

A tooth that has undergone successful root canal treatment, followed by proper coronal restoration, can function normally for a lifetime with routine oral hygiene. Patients are advised to maintain consistent morning and evening brushing habits, perform daily flossing, and attend regular cleanings and examinations to monitor the integrity of the restoration.
