



Beartooth Fencing LLC Expands Fence Installation Services for Montana Ranch Conditions

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Beartooth Fencing LLC, a licensed and insured fencing and ranch construction contractor based in Columbus, Montana, has formally expanded its fence installation services to address the full range of conditions found across the region, including high wind, frost heave, rocky ground, and livestock pressure.

The expanded offering from Beartooth Fencing Fence Installation covers multiple fencing types built for practical ranch and rural use. These include traditional barbed wire fencing constructed to Montana rangeland standards, classic wood post and rail fencing, and no-dig jack leg (buck and rail) fencing designed for terrain where digging is difficult. The company also builds working corrals and pens for safe livestock handling and horse-rated equine fencing designed with animal welfare in mind.

Beyond standard fencing, the company constructs tall, heavy-duty game fence intended to contain wildlife on a property. Additional services include custom-designed entrance archways and custom gates with automation options such as automatic openers, keypads, and remotes.

The emphasis on region-specific construction reflects the demands placed on fencing in the Beartooth area, where seasonal weather shifts and difficult ground can affect the longevity of standard installations. Frost heave, in particular, presents challenges for conventional post-setting methods, which is one reason the company offers no-dig jack leg options suited to rocky soil.

"Fencing in Montana has to stand up to conditions that would fail lesser work in a season or two," said Brandon Garoutte of Beartooth Fencing LLC. "The goal with this expanded service focus is to match the right fencing method to the ground, the animals, and the property, rather than applying a single approach to every project."

Each fencing type serves a distinct purpose. Barbed wire remains a common choice for rangeland boundaries, while post and rail fencing is often selected for estates and ranch entrances where appearance matters. Jack leg fencing addresses areas where post holes are impractical, and equine fencing prioritizes safety for horses. Game fence provides the height and strength required for wildlife containment.

"Every property has its own requirements," Garoutte added. "A working corral needs to prioritize livestock safety and daily function, while a custom archway or automated gate is about making a lasting impression at the entrance. Both matter, and both call for careful planning."

The company provides free on-site estimates for projects throughout Columbus and the surrounding Beartooth Region. Beartooth Fencing maintains licensed and insured service from initial assessment through completion on each project.

In addition to fencing, the company offers related ranch construction work, including pole barns, livestock shelters such as run-in sheds and loafing shelters, equestrian facility design, and general contracting for property projects of varying scope.
