



Fraser Valley Junk Solutions Announces Availability of Property Cleanout Services Across Expanded Service Areas

Operational efficiency has also improved, with trucks that are approximately 15% larger than the industry average in the area, allowing crews to remove more material per trip and reduce the time required to complete larger cleanout projects.

Some cleanout projects involve additional logistical considerations. Properties with multiple levels, limited access points, or large volumes of heavy items may require additional labour or specialized equipment. In these situations, advance planning is often necessary to ensure that crews are prepared to complete the job safely and within the expected timeframe.
