



Atlanta Metro Law Addresses Left-Turn Motorcycle Crash Risks

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Atlanta Metro Law is addressing the legal challenges facing motorcycle riders injured in left-turn and intersection collisions, following a fatal crash in southeast Atlanta and ahead of heightened traffic enforcement across Georgia. The firm is drawing attention to the frequency of left-turn conflicts in motorcycle fatalities, a crash pattern that the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration has identified as a significant contributor to rider deaths nationwide, and to the legal considerations that arise when a driver fails to yield to an approaching motorcycle at a signal-controlled intersection.

The firm is highlighting the fatal August 28, 2026 collision at Memorial Drive SE and Boulevard SE in Atlanta, where the Atlanta Police Department's Accident Investigations Unit determined that a BMW SUV failed to yield to a Harley-Davidson motorcycle, killing the male motorcyclist. APD investigators identified the failure-to-yield mechanism as the primary crash factor. The department's findings addressed the failure to yield and did not, as reported, attribute the crash to phone use or other distraction.

Left-turn conflicts occur when a turning driver does not detect an oncoming rider before entering the rider's path. At intersections where motorcyclists approach at speed, riders may have little opportunity to brake before a turning vehicle occupies the lane. Traffic-safety researchers, including NHTSA, have repeatedly examined driver inattention as one factor among several that can contribute to a driver's failure to perceive an approaching motorcycle, though the causes in any individual crash depend on the specific circumstances.

Georgia's Hands-Free Act provides a legal framework relevant to intersection crashes. HB 673, codified at O.C.G.A. § 40-6-241 since July 1, 2018, prohibits drivers from holding or using a phone while operating a vehicle. When a driver who violated the statute causes a crash, that violation may support a negligence per se argument under Georgia law. Whether the doctrine applies, and whether it establishes liability, depends on the facts of the case, the applicable statute, and how a court evaluates the conduct at issue.

The firm noted that the crash comes as Georgia authorities have signaled increased attention to distracted driving. Georgia State Patrol designated distracted driving as an enforcement priority during the 2026 Labor Day period, alongside speeding and impaired driving, with troopers and Commercial Vehicle Enforcement officers targeting phone use on high-traffic corridors.

A spokesperson for Atlanta Metro Law addressed the role of the Hands-Free Act in motorcycle crash claims. "When a driver who was holding or using a phone fails to yield to a motorcycle, a Hands-Free Act violation can support a negligence per se argument, which may reduce what an injured rider must independently prove about duty and breach, though the outcome still depends on Georgia law and the facts," said a representative for Atlanta Metro, firm spokesperson. "Cell phone carrier records showing call, text, or app activity around the time of an intersection crash can be significant evidence, and because retention practices vary by carrier and record type, riders are encouraged to seek advice promptly."
