Which steps become relevant depends on the allegations, evidence, jurisdiction, and procedural posture of the individual case.

State and federal criminal allegations can carry consequences that extend beyond the immediate court process. Because outcomes cannot be guaranteed, the new guidance avoids presenting any single strategy as appropriate for every matter. Instead, it encourages careful evaluation of legal experience, familiarity with the applicable court system, and the attorney's ability to address the specific factual and procedural issues involved. It also underscores the value of seeking legal counsel early, when there may be more time to review evidence, assess options, and prepare for upcoming proceedings.
