



Workers Compensation Lawyer Coalition Details Notice Rules

ATLANTA, GA - September 18, 2026 -

Workers' Compensation Lawyer Coalition has issued guidance addressing procedural requirements that affect injured manufacturing and distribution workers in Conyers and throughout Rockdale County, where much of the local economy places employees in daily contact with heavy machinery, industrial chemicals, and warehouse logistics operations. Rockdale County's employment base includes manufacturing and distribution employers such as Pratt Industries' paper and packaging operations, Hill Phoenix commercial refrigeration equipment manufacturing, Golden State Foods, Air Products, LioChem, and Tempur-Sealy. Injuries commonly associated with these settings include forklift accidents, machine entanglement, crush injuries, and chemical exposure.

The I-20 corridor warehouse and distribution network between Conyers and Lithonia employs many Rockdale County residents in forklift operation, pallet jack handling, loading dock work, and repetitive-motion order fulfillment. Work of this kind is frequently associated with claims for back, shoulder, and knee injuries, as well as carpal tunnel syndrome. According to the coalition, insurers in some cases dispute whether such injuries arose from employment or reflect pre-existing conditions, which can shift the burden to the worker to document how the injury occurred.

The coalition's guidance focuses on two Georgia statutory requirements it describes as frequently misunderstood. Under O.C.G.A. § 34-9-80, an injured worker generally must notify the employer of a work injury, and the statute addresses the timing and consequences of that notice, including a 30-day window that can affect a claim. The coalition notes that, while notice to a supervisor may be given verbally, documenting notice in writing, such as through a text message or email, can help establish a record. The coalition states that a worker who provides only verbal notice may face disputes over whether statutory notice requirements were satisfied. These statements reflect the coalition's general reading of Georgia law and are not a substitute for advice on an individual claim.

The second requirement concerns the authorized physician panel. Under Georgia's workers' compensation framework, employers are generally required to post a panel of authorized physicians from which an injured worker selects a treating doctor. The coalition explains that a worker who obtains non-emergency treatment outside the posted panel may, in some circumstances, encounter disputes over coverage for that treatment. Georgia law permits injured workers to seek emergency care at the nearest appropriate facility, such as Piedmont Rockdale Medical Center, without the same panel considerations. The coalition advises that questions can arise when a worker continues treating outside an authorized panel after the emergency phase, and it encourages workers to confirm panel details with the employer or a qualified attorney.

"In the first hours after a serious work injury, the written notice requirement under O.C.G.A. § 34-9-80 and the authorized physician panel are among the most consequential procedural steps a Conyers worker encounters," said a spokesperson for Workers' Compensation Lawyer Coalition. "A worker who relies only on verbal notice and later treats outside the panel may face disputes on both fronts at once. General guidance of this kind is not a substitute for a review of an individual claim, which is why the coalition works to document notice, confirm the authorized panel, and, where appropriate, file Form WC-14 with the State Board of Workers' Compensation."

The coalition assists Conyers and Rockdale County workers with the notice, panel, and filing steps that arise early in a claim. Additional information is available through the WCL ATL Conyers Workers Compensation Lawyer resource on the firm's website.
