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Canadian travelers are increasingly booking fall and winter trips to Morocco as airlines add seasonal routes and travelers seek warm-weather cultural experiences beyond traditional sun destinations. Morocco recorded 17.4 million visitors in 2024, as reported by the Ministry of Tourism, and the country has continued to see strong travel demand throughout 2025 and 2026 as new air routes have expanded access from North American markets. Royal Air Maroc launched direct Montreal-to-Marrakech service in 2025, and Air Canada has increased frequencies to Casablanca from both Montreal and Toronto, making Morocco more accessible than ever for Canadian travelers.

The country's year-round mild climate in cities like Marrakech and Agadir makes it an appealing alternative to Caribbean or Mexican getaways for travelers who want cultural depth alongside warm weather. "The fall and winter are actually beautiful times to explore Morocco because the crowds have thinned and the light is soft for photography," said Said, head guide and founder of Morocco Countryside Tours. "Canadian travelers tend to appreciate the slower pace and the chance to connect with local Berber communities rather than just seeing the famous landmarks. Many of our Canadian guests tell us they prefer our private tours because they can spend real time in the villages and learn about daily life from people who actually live there."

Morocco Countryside Tours specializes in private itineraries that combine Sahara desert camps, imperial city tours, and coastal excursions into single trips. The company offers Sahara desert camps and camel treks in Erg Chebbi, where visitors spend nights in traditional tents under the desert sky while Berber guides prepare meals over open fire and share stories about nomadic traditions that have been passed down through generations.

For travelers arriving from Canadian gateway cities, tours from Marrakech provide convenient starting points with direct flight access. Multi-day itineraries typically include guided exploration of UNESCO World Heritage sites such as the medina of Fes, widely considered one of the world's best-preserved medieval cities, the Roman ruins of Volubilis with its well-preserved mosaics dating back to the third century, and the blue-washed streets of Chefchaouen in the Rif Mountains. Each destination offers distinct landscapes and cultural traditions, making multi-stop itineraries increasingly popular among travelers who want variety without the hassle of planning logistics across different regions.

Fall and winter temperatures in Morocco are generally mild, with daytime highs in Marrakech averaging 20 to 25 degrees Celsius between October and March. This makes outdoor activities such as camel trekking, mountain hiking, and medina walking tours comfortable throughout the season. The coastal city of Agadir maintains even milder temperatures and draws travelers interested in Atlantic surf culture alongside traditional Moroccan experiences.
