Washington, as well as local and international visitors.

In addition to the Caribbean-flavored gastronomical delights that will be on offer, patrons will receive musical

entertainment from top Reggae and Soca acts. The entertainment line-up is made up of some well-known

names in the regional and international music business, including Freddie McGregor, Christopher Martin and

Ikaya, all hailing from Jamaica, along with Barbadian Soca singer, Edwin Yearwood and the Pan Lara Youth

Steel Orchestra. Comedian Michael Campbell will perform emcee duties for the festival.

The inaugural staging of the Grace Jamaican Jerk Festival marks the eighth anniversary of the observance of

Caribbean American Heritage Month. June was set aside for the celebration by U.S. President, Barack

Obama, in recognition of the contribution of the Caribbean people to the American society. With an

approximate population of 10 million people from 30 territories, the Caribbean community living in the United

States has significantly influenced the country?s culture and politics, as well as added to its economic

achievements.
