In addition, parents should not bundle up a baby or infant with many layers of clothing or blankets, as this could prevent the fever from going down. One layer each of lightweight clothing and a blanket would be

enough. The room should also be comfortable, neither too hot or too cold. Most doctors prescribe acetaminophen or ibuprofen to help lower the fever in babies and infants. However, it is important that parents seek medical advice before administering medicine.

To accurately assess a fever, MedlinePlus recommended that parents have their own thermometers, like the
