



Rocky Mountain Plumbing & Drain Issues Gas Line Safety Guidance for Utah Property Owners

Rocky Mountain Plumbing & Drain has released new safety guidance urging Utah homeowners and business operators to treat gas line concerns as a matter for licensed professionals rather than do-it-yourself repair. The Sandy-based company, which serves Salt Lake County, Utah County, and communities along the Wasatch Front, points to a range of common warning signs that property owners often overlook until a problem becomes serious.

Among the indicators highlighted in the guidance are the smell of gas near appliances or fixtures, aging connections on older lines, and visible corrosion on pipes or fittings. The company notes that risks can also increase during periods of change, such as adding a new gas appliance, completing a remodel, or installing outdoor gas features like fire pits and patio heaters. In each case, a gas line evaluation by Rocky Mountain Plumbing & Drain is intended to identify potential faults before they lead to leaks or damage.

The guidance places particular emphasis on shutoff access and on completing safety checks before any

repair or upgrade work begins. According to the company, property owners frequently do not know where their main gas shutoff is located or whether it remains fully operable, a detail that can matter greatly during an emergency. The company recommends that connections be inspected by a qualified technician whenever a line is decades old or when appliances are being replaced.

"Gas lines do not offer many second chances, and small warning signs deserve immediate attention," said Cade Ward, owner of Rocky Mountain Plumbing & Drain. "A faint odor, a corroded fitting, or a connection that has not been checked in years can all point to a condition that should be evaluated before it worsens."

Ward added that timing matters as much as the inspection itself. "The safest moment to check a gas system is before work starts, not after," he said. "When a homeowner is planning a remodel or adding an appliance, a review of the existing line and shutoff access should be part of the process rather than an afterthought."

The company frames its role as safety-first plumbing support for both homes and businesses. Its gas line services include inspections for those adding an appliance, guidance for anyone noticing possible signs of trouble, and evaluations of older lines that have not been reviewed in some time. The company advises against attempting repairs on gas connections without proper licensing, given the safety and code requirements involved.

As part of a broader Rocky Mountain Plumbing & Drain licensed and insured contractor update, the company reaffirmed that its technicians operate under state licensing and insurance standards for work performed across the region it serves. The company stated that this status applies to its gas line, water heater, and drain services alike.
