Pet owners should also be vigilant of the products used for their dogs. Avoid using products that may contain toxic chemicals or cancer causing agents. Pet owners are strongly advised to check and read the label on dog shampoos. "Always compare the ingredients on the list before deciding to buy any product," said Farrar. She also advised that dog parents should be proactive in doing their homework, read the news, and do their research before buying any product.

One good option in order to avoid any form of health risks is to invest in natural soaps. Natural dog shampoos are made with all-natural ingredients including shea butter, coconut oil, olive oil, soybean oil, hemp oil, and essential oils.
