



Increase in Missing Persons Threatens All, says Melbourne Private Investigator

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Alexandra Debray, a private investigator based in Melbourne, has warned the public that an increase in cases of missing or unaccounted deaths should be something to worry about for everyone in Melbourne and beyond.

She says, "If anyone wants to protect their loved ones from getting kidnapped, start by watching closely everyone around you. "In my experience, it is best to take precautions and stop crimes from happening. Moreover, in our case here, I can only hope that everyone warns their loved ones to be careful even as we continue to entrust our police," Debray said.
