Reasons / Causes

The number one cause of separation anxiety is a human?s lack of leadership. A dog must instinctually see his owner as the pack leader. In a pack, the leader is allowed to leave, but followers never do so. If a dog sees his owner as a follower and this follower leaves, it causes concern that something will happen to one of

the pack members for which he is responsible. It can cause so much mental anguish that a dog often takes it out on his surroundings. To a lesser degree, separation anxiety can be the result of lack of exercise.

Symptoms

The American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA) list some of the common symptoms of separation anxiety as; barking or howling, urination & Earp; defection, escaping, chewing, digging & Earp; destruction, pacing, and over-excitement upon return of the owner. Medical problems such as incontinence should be ruled out first with a ?check-up? trip to the family veterinarian.

Treatment

It is the job of the pet owner to make this unnatural situation less stressful to the animal. According to Widmer, ?Many pet owners make the mistake of treating a dog as if it?s human, all it takes is a change in approach on the part of the human to ease separation anxiety.? He continues, ?Behaviour modification such as changing a dog?s association with the human?s departure and gradual acclimation to being alone for longer periods of absence have proven to be the best remedies.? Many dog lovers have found that regular bathing with a natural pet shampoo eliminates skin irritations resulting in one less agitation to the dog while alone. ?A regular pet bathing regime is a good preventative measure to ensure an animal?s continual good health by removing foreign toxins that they can pick-up on their coat and fur.?
