Barking/Howling

Most pet owners expect dogs to bark to some degree, it is excessive barking that becomes an issue. The main reasons for canine vocalization are warning/alert, response to other dogs, excitement/playfulness,

anxiety/distress, and attention seeking. Barking is a very important part of canine communication and rather than simply trying to quell a barking dog, effort should be made to determine the reasons and apply appropriate measures of correction.

Jumping-Up

Put simply, jumping-up is an attempt by a dog to assert dominance. This is regularly misread as an enthusiastic greeting or playfulness. Encouraging jumping-up by giving the dog affection, will only send the wrong message and re-enforce the behavior.

Digging

This is a purely instinctual activity for a dog, and is especially strong in terrier breeds with a history of hunting. Common reasons for exhibitions of digging from a domesticated canine include: excess energy or boredom, hiding possessions such as toys or bones, and comfort seeking such as nesting.

Digging in the yard can be frustrating for a pet owner as the result is a dirty and offensive smelling pet, and when they come inside they often transmit the dirt and odors to home surfaces. According to Widmer, "Many commercial pet products contain harsh chemicals, and frequent bathing with these commercial products dry out the skin and coat of a dog. Pet owners want to be confident that they are not causing harm to their best friends by bathing them more often." One good option is to invest in a natural dog shampoo in order to avoid the negative effects of the toxic chemicals that many commercial pet products contain.
