Accessible Systems reached out to the Home Builder?s Foundation of Metro Denver, where Mr. Colburn currently volunteers as a board member and member of the Gifting Committee. The work was approved and completely funded for Jeaninne.

Accessible Systems was able to install a powerful chairlift in Kasa's property, as well as make her bathroom

accessible. Additionally, they helped to widen the home?s hallways. Through the foundation, people are able

to access these services and have any fees that are not covered by insurance waived. For Kasa, it felt like

she had her dream home once again.

For Colburn, helping people like Jeaninne Kasa has become a personal mission. "You go into a person?s

home and you realize that this is a great person with a supportive family," says Colburn, "and yet most homes

are not designed to accommodate special needs. It?s amazing to witness how thankful and excited people

get about the little things?it makes you grateful for what you have. We realized that it took Jeaninne almost

an hour to get to her car, and it was maybe once a month that she could leave the house. Now she can do it

every day."

Every person with Multiple Sclerosis has needs that are complex, but these complexities can be overcome

with resources. Thanks to the work of Accessible Systems, Ms. Kasa will once again be able to enjoy her

home.
