mobility problems or experience difficulties in performing such activities, an assisted living facility may be for them.

For loved ones who have Alzheimer's disease or dementia, Alzheimer's care communities are available. However, it should be noted that while more than 5.5 million people in the US are estimated to have Alzheimer's, only one in four are diagnosed. Thus, it is essential to obtain a diagnosis if people notice certain symptoms in their loved ones. Alzheimer's accounts for 60 to 80 percent of all dementia cases. Symptoms of dementia include worsening memory loss and decline in thinking skills that impedes the affected person's ability to perform daily tasks. Other symptoms include decline in visual perception, mental reasoning, good judgment, attention, and communication.

For the elderly who require assistance but prefer a home-like atmosphere, the residential care home is often recommended. These care homes are often residential homes or communal homes that can have six or less residents. Being able to provide a homey environment, the elderly will have a comfortable and relaxed living space. Qualified care assistants are available to help the seniors in doing daily tasks. Trained nurses may also be available when required.

Other living options for seniors are nursing homes, senior apartments, memory care homes, and independent living. Nursing homes provide 24-hour medical care and personal care services. These are most suitable for the elderly who cannot be cared for at home but need intensive medical attention. These seniors are usually those who have chronic illness or are recovering from injuries. Nursing homes can also provide services such as physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, memory therapy, and more. Unlike assisted living facilities, nursing homes have complete medical equipment, such as oxygen tanks, electronic beds, and dialysis machines. These are actually long-term care facilities and offer daily meals, personal care, medication monitoring, social programs and various activities, laundry, and housekeeping.

Meanwhile, senior apartments are usually for seniors with ages 55 and up but are in good health and are able to live independently. These are independent living communities for the elderly who are able to perform the various tasks of daily living, such as eating, dressing, bathing and other activities. They are also able to live independently and do not require any personal care assistance. These seniors are active and are able to function well on their own.

For the elderly with Alzheimer's disease, dementia or other kinds of memory problems, memory care homes offer a distinct form of long-term care. These are staffed by nurses with specialized skills. They have special training on assisting people who have impaired cognition.
