The car itself may show problems such as the vehicle jumping to a particular gear and staying there, or dragging at slow speeds despite enough gas in the tank. In many models, if the transmission has caused the car to be too dangerous, the internal computer in the car will shift into second or third gear and stay there in order to shift into survival mode. The car is still drivable, but is severely restricted until it is repaired.

"Once your driving is restricted in limp mode, bring it to us right away," says the spokesperson. "While it's still drivable, it's certainly not as safe for you or other drivers on the road. When you're having gearbox problems, come see us."

One of the most common problems that can cause a Mercedes Benz to go into limp mode is a faulty neutral safety switch. The safety switch is designed to prevent the car from starting when the clutch is not depressed while the car is in neutral. Without the switch, the car would be able to start in any gear, causing it to launch forward or backward, which can be dangerous.

The spokesperson says, "If you are finding that your engine is cranking, that could a sign that you need to get

your car looked at right away. The car could even be parked and in neutral, and the engine could still crank

because of a faulty switch. There are a number of component issues that could be causing the problem. We
