Children were also able to shop for special treasures in the Snowdrop Market. Kids and parents were also able to do some holiday shopping at the Sleighbell Boutique. Available were natural toys, handmade ornaments, specialty books, decor items, woolen and organic clothing, Waldorf dolls, and more.

Jennifer Deathe, admissions manager at Waldorf Academy, had this to say about the winter fair, ?Storytelling

Meanwhile, the childcare program is designed to offer a place for young children such that the parents have peace of mind, trusting that their children are in safe and caring environment. Furthermore, the children engage in age-appropriate activities designed to help in their emotional, intellectual, social, and physical development. For toddlers, 18 months to 2.5 years old, they are immersed in an environment that is similar to the home under the guidance of a caregiver who is nurturing. For preschool children, 2.5 to 4 years old, they are allowed to make independent discoveries through their experiences and through their own creative play.

The approach used at Waldorf Academy is based on the statement of Rudolf Steiner, "We must still make the lifeless things live through imagination and always connect them with real life. It is possible to connect all the phenomena of physics with real life, but we ourselves must have imagination in order to do it." Jennifer Deathe explains that the essence of Waldorf Academy can be summarized as a focus on creativity, emotional intelligence, resilience & perseverance, and intellectual development. By focusing on creativity in problem solving, a child?s ability to think critically and independently is improved. Development of the child?s emotional intelligence is also vital because success in life has been found to favor those who have a high EQ. And then hands-on, experiential and inquiry-based learning is emphasized to nurture in the children the ability to take risks, go beyond their comfort zones, and test their mettle.
