Hemp is a versatile crop that has been cultivated for over 10,000 years. It has been used traditionally to

Urban legend even suggests that early versions of Levi Strauss jeans may have been made of durable hemp cloth and that some Gold Rush 49ers may have worn rugged hemp jeans.

?So you see,? Martin continues, ?hemp has a long history as a paper and textile crop. But it?s also been used for other industrial purposes. In the 1920s, for instance, Henry Ford combined soybean and hemp fiber to create tough car panels and, more recently, hemp can be found in cutting edge ?green? construction materials such as innovative hemp fiberboard and hemp concrete.
