Normally, it takes around two to twelve days after the initial period of exposure for people to notice they have herpes. While there are instances of recurring herpes, as time goes on, there tends to be more remission periods and less severe occurrences. For example, while symptoms of primary infection could include vaginal discharge, pain, itching, high temperatures, cold sores, or red blisters on the skin, a recurrent infection has

deals mostly with blisters, and perhaps a small burning feeling. Transmission can occur when having unprotected intercourse, oral intercourse, or sharing adult toys. Furthermore, mothers can potentially pass on the disease to their children.

Treatment options at home may include taking painkillers, having salt water baths, using petroleum jelly, wearing loose clothing, washing hands often, and more. In addition, possible medicinal avenues include taking antivirals such as acyclovir to keep the virus from spreading and multiplying, as well as to clear the outbreak. Doctors usually prescribe a five-day course of antivirals for each recurrence.
