He notes that it is difficult to make important decisions when in a state of extreme physical discomfort and this may, in turn, negatively influence a buyer’s decisions.

“You can’t think clearly when you’re freezing,” he says. “It’s quite literally more difficult. Bies points out that there are a few signs that homeowners can look out for that may indicate their furnace needs to undergo repairs. While it is easy to conclude that a furnace is not working if it does not turn on or refuses to heat a home’s interior, he states that more subtle signs can highlight a problem. “Keep in mind that letting your furnace function with certain kinds of issues can actually make things worse in the long run,” he warns. “While we advise switching out your furnace for a new unit if it is too old or beyond repair, we don’t want to see units reach the end of their life cycle prematurely.”

These warning signs include odd smells emitting from the furnace during operation, (such as the smell of

rotten eggs, which should be taken note of immediately as this may mean there is a gas leak), rising energy bills that cannot be explained by other changes in the household, and even sudden noises that were not present during prior use (such as grinding, screeching, and so on).

According to Bies, certain thresholds can be used to gauge whether a furnace needs a repair or a replacement. The Edmonton furnace contractor says that homeowners should consider the age of their furnace?furnaces that are nearing 15 years of age, for instance, should be given more scrutiny as they are likely to be near the end of their lifespan. Bies also states that another good rule of thumb is to think about replacing a furnace if the cost of repairs for a single project exceeds 50% of the cost of a new furnace. Similarly, having the unit repaired many times in a short period can be a sign that it is about to give up for good, and the cost of multiple repairs may be better invested in a new unit.

Bies says, "Your home is expected to be a place where you can relax, stretch your legs, and just let the worries of the day slip away. However, if your furnace isn't running properly, or has been ill-maintained for a long period of time, then it's easy to find your home enveloped in an uncomfortable, chilly cloud.
