New foot and ankle surgical instruments are also available. These include scalpel handles, scissors, super-cut scissors, tissue forceps, dressing forceps, splinter forceps, needle holders, hemostatic forceps, handheld retractors, self-retaining retractors, excavators / probes / packers, elevators, bone holding forceps, knives, nail splitters, chisel, osteotomes, mallets, tamps, bone files and rasps, bone cutters, bone rongeurs, cast removal, trephines, tissue nippers, nail splitters, nail nippers, k-wires, pliers, wire driver, wire and pin cutters, and instrument care and cleaning. The Saxena-style retractor has a ratchet that is calibrated in mm and is useful in various kinds of procedures to accurately determine bone graft needs.

Super-cut scissors have fine blades designed for cutting delicate tissue. These have serrated blade patterns to avoid tissue slippage and for effortless cutting. The stainless steel used in fabricating these super-cut scissors underwent heat treatment to provide a long-lasting razor sharp edge. The Abramssohn retractor is used to facilitate lateral release during bunionectomy procedures.

Apiary Medical also provides veterinary surgical instruments. These include towel clamps, needle driver, scalpel handle, suture scissors, thumb forceps, hemostatic forceps, crile forceps, and Carmalt forceps.
