For publishers who make use of RSS, there are benefits too. RSS helps not only to generate new users through increased search engine placement, but it also helps websites to generate repeat visitors. They return because they have seen the RSS notification and want to return.

There are many websites though, that do not have the staff or expertise to set up a dedicated RSS feed for themselves. In addition, many websites using outdated eCommerce software or content management systems may struggle with the practicalities of RSS and this is where mySiteFeed.com comes into the equation.
