



Pool Cue Guide Shares Advice For Beginners On Finding The Right Pool Cue

However, what they don't quite understand is that your main focus should be getting the "right" pool cue. Why? The answer is simple: not every good pool cue is necessarily the right one for a beginner. If you are a beginner, what you need is a cue that is durable, easy to handle, straight, and of accurate size. That's what you need to keep in mind."

In the blog post, the company explains further. Speaking about the material of the pool cue, Pool Cue Guide says that the focus should be on finding durable material. According to the company, maple cues are the ones that most often tend to be the most durable for beginners to the sport. Since beginners will likely be practicing often, having a durable cue is critical.

The post continues, "When it comes to accurate size, three things that need to be considered are the length, weight, and straight design. While the average length is 57 to 59 inches, the average weight of a cue is 18 to 21 ounces. The straighter and smoother the cue, the easier it will be for you to strike the ball. The cue must not have any warping or curves at all. As a beginner, make sure the cue is not too long or too heavy for you to handle."

According to the company, another aspect to consider is whether the pool cue is one-piece or two-piece. However, the blog post says that while this factor is important, it ultimately comes down to personal preference. For those who travel a lot, a two-piece cue is recommended as it makes transportation easier. However, for those who just play and practice at home or a nearby club, the one-piece cue is good enough.

Something else to consider is that the pool cue has a good balance point. The balance point is the center of gravity of the pool cue and is situated a few inches from the wrap's end. Pool Cue Guide's blog post says that better the balance point, the easier it is to handle and make a shot with the cue. The final factor to consider is the tip, and the post says that a softer cue tip made of rubber or leather is a good choice for beginners.
