The company explains that radon is a gas that cannot be smelled, tasted or seen. It forms naturally when uranium, thorium, or radium, all radioactive metals, breaks down in rocks, soil and groundwater. People are often exposed to radon by breathing the radon in air that comes through cracks and gaps in buildings and homes. As radon comes naturally from the earth, people are always exposed to it. This is why, during testing, radon test devices will be placed in the lowest occupied level of the home. According to the company, having one's home tested is the only effective way to determine whether they are at risk of high radon exposure. Harig says, "Radon is also known as The Silent Killer due to how undetectable it is. Odorless, colorless and non-combustible, radon does its damage over the long term, causing the development of lung cancer in those exposed to it for a moderate to long period of time. The last thing you want is to be in a constant state of risk in your home. Why not ensure your home is safe for you and your loved ones?"

The company explains that, as radon levels can vary from day to day and from season to season, testing can be done in two different ways: short-term (two to 90 days) or long-term (greater than three months). Short-term tests are used in cases when the results are needed quickly and should be followed by another short-term test. However, long-term tests will yield better information on a home's average year-round radon levels.

In the blog post, the company also explains possible natural causes for radon level fluctuation. One of the reasons the company provides is light wind or rain, saying that these weather phenomena can have a small but noticeable impact on radon levels. However, heavy wind, rain or other stormy conditions can have a severe impact on a house's radon test levels. The radon levels of one's home can become higher during rainstorms, and this is due to barometric pressure changes as well as changes in the soil beneath and around the home.

Harig says, "Radon levels are subject to environmental factors. However, you can take an active role in ensuring your home is safe for all who live there.
