The article points out that there are a number of possible reasons for switching from methadone to suboxone. However, there are a number of complexities that also need to be considered. For instance, there is the possibility of the patient withdrawing from methadone medication because of its higher receptor affinity. It is therefore important to consult with a professional before attempting to switch from methadone to suboxone. In most cases, medical practitioners will suggest the reduction of methadone doses or to totally discontinue its use for a number of days before switching to suboxone medication.

Melanie Eilers, Senior Director of Communications at Pinnacle Treatment Centers, says, ?Subutex is also a medicine that is used extensively to treat OUD and is somewhat similar to Suboxone. Both Suboxone and Subutex contain buprenorphine; however, Subutex contains only buprenorphine, whereas Suboxone contains both buprenorphine and naloxone. Buprenorphine/Subutex/Suboxone is a newly approved medicine for OUD and is used both during and after the process of detoxification in treating OUD. Subutex is a long-acting medication that is known to provide stable, low-level activation of opioid receptors in the brain and hence, prevents the agonizing withdrawal symptoms and cravings in a person.?

Just like suboxone, subutex may be prescribed instead of methadone for a number of reasons. Those who are dependent on short-acting opioids and can take medications and can commit to attending the related consulting/therapy sessions on time would be more suitable to taking subutex rather than methadone. In addition, practitioners may also recommend switching from methadone to subutex for the same reasons that it might be advisable to switch to suboxone.

Reasons for possibly switching from methadone to suboxone include: the presence of side effects from methadone compared to the fewer side effects of suboxone; the fact that the methadone doses are being metabolized quicker; the fact that the patient has recovered to a certain degree and methadone treatment is no longer required; and the fact that suboxone medication is convenient because it can be taken at home after a few sessions of taking it under the supervision of a doctor.
