When it comes to choosing one of these sites, there are several factors that you need to consider. Wilson explains that, when it comes to free camping Australia has some of the most beautiful destinations in the world. This means, however, that many locations are likely to have campers at any given time. Popular locations attract more visitors, and with this, the cost of maintenance and upkeep goes up as well. The most popular locations often have a stay-in fee, which means that those looking for a truly free experience should stay away from popular sites and visit other, lesser-known locations.

For those who do not mind paying a small fee to spend the night in these popular locations, the company

states that there are several options to choose from. Caravan parks or the paid campgrounds provided by the respective state's national parks are some of the most popular, with prices varying from \$5/night to \$40/night, depending on the location and whether the campers want powered or unpowered sites. Other private campgrounds all over Australia are extremely cost-effective as well, including showgrounds, pubs and clubs that charge a small fee, making the range of paid camping options quite plentiful in nature.

Aside from these few paid camping locations, the company states that free campgrounds are also a viable option for those looking to travel around Australia. Wilson states, "These locations are a bit more remote than the previous ones, though they are just as beautiful and relaxing. Keep in mind that you must have access to a tool or resource whereby you can accurately find those locations but, more importantly, find any rules and regulations that each site might have in place so you do not incur a hefty fine. If you keep this in mind, however, there should not be any problem with you staying in these locations, many if not all of which will deliver exceptionally in providing the wilderness adventure that you desire."

Having chosen the best option for free camping in Australia, the company states that the next step is to choose a specific location, though this is easier said than done.
