inches for those using wheelchairs. There are also inclusions on height and size requirements for sinks, grab bars, toilets, and stalls. It is worth noting that sensors and automatic faucets are acceptable under ADA guidelines as long as they can be used with one hand. This guideline will allow businesses to transition to touchless fixtures to prevent the spread of the coronavirus and other contagions.
