Data such as retention rates tells students how many first-time students returned to the school the following year. A low retention rate is a potential red flag. Graduation rates describe what percentage of first-time students received a degree within 150% of the standard program time. That standard program time is generally 4-6 years. Again, a low graduation rate might indicate some type of systemic issue.

Sometimes, low rates are positive elements. That is true of a school's acceptance rate, the rate of the number of students accepted versus the number of applicants. The lower the acceptance rate, the more selective the school. Schools with low acceptance rates usually have excellent reputations. Acceptance rates refer to first-time, first-year students only.

Because affordability is a key component of this list, the Discover Early Childhood rankings include colleges offering the best value, but not at the expense of a quality education. Also listed is the average salary for graduates, so that students know whether these are the most competitive rates in the field. While tuition is a big aspect of affordability, it is not the sole criteria. Some schools provide generous scholarship and grant opportunities for students and may offer significant work/study possibilities.

Those fortunate enough to live in the New York City metropolitan area might consider attending one of the four city universities on the list. The same holds true for those in California or Texas, which also have more than one school in the top 10. However, there are good early childhood education programs available nationwide.
