Chiropractic is a non-surgical treatment that heals the body by fixing its structural integrity. A lot of work in chiropractic focuses on the alignment of the spinal cord. The human spine has 24 bones each of which are connected to certain regions of the body through nerves. The spine is separated into 3 broad sections, the neck, the mid-back, and the low-back. These sections protect the nervous system. Each area of bone is there to protect the nerve system as it runs to its assigned portion of the body. When there are problems in the nervous system, the body will begin to react in unpredictable and painful ways. As an example, problems with bones in the neck can cause problems from the back of the head to the ear, pain in the trapezius muscle down to the arms and hands. A lot of times carpal tunnel can be caused by a bone in the neck disturbing the nerve telling the arm/hand how to work.

Dr. Yvonne says that she has felt the pain first hand and she can empathize with those going through the same problems. She traveled the world and learned about the truth behind health. She says that she wants to help her community by giving them the benefits of the knowledge and experience that she has acquired. She

When the curves of the spinal cord are lost, the spinal cord can no longer fit perfectly inside the spinal canal. This loss of curve or misalignment of the vertebrae is called a subluxation. Chiropractic doctors take subluxations very seriously and treat them with the same seriousness as cancer or a heart attack.
